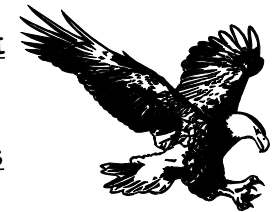

School Summary

Kleberg Elementary proudly provides children of Kingsville, who are in the second, third and fourth grade, an excellent education. We are currently staffed with 8 second, third and fourth grade classes and three special needs units.

In order to insure that all students needs are met, Kleberg has many other professionals and/or classes that may tailor to your students needs. Each grade level has gifted and talented students placed in the same class which are taught by gifted and talented certified teachers. Each grade level also has a special education teacher who works with students one on one, or in small groups.

Kleberg Elementary also goes beyond assisting our students in the classroom by providing a counselor, speech therapist and nurse on the campus.

The Kingsville Independent School District provides transportation by bus to Kleberg Elementary in the morning and afternoon. The school district also serves hot breakfast and lunch to our students. Families in need of applying for free or reduced lunch for their child may pick up an application in the office.

From The Principal

Kleberg Elementary, like the person it is named after, has a proud history. Established in 1921 as the Kingsville Cotton Mill, it produced yarn from locally grown cotton which was then shipped to the North and East for carpet production. However, due to low profits, it closed down in 1924.

It later reopened that same year by the San Antonio Cotton Mill to make Ford Model-T transmissions and brake band linings. During this time it also packaged twine and processed 264 pounds of cotton an hour during the mill's peak and employed 250 workers. As a result, the Kingsville economy was positively affected.

During World War II the building was leased and produced cotton twine and khaki belts for military uniforms. When the war ended, the factory was closed and was acquired by The King Ranch. In 1947 Alice G.K. Kleberg Elementary School was presented to the community as a gift.

Today Kleberg Elementary has approximately 464 students. The campus is made strong by the commitment of its teachers, staff members, and parents.
